
Emergency Volunteers at the Resort

Access to Emergency Equipment

Most emergency equipment is kept in the Resort Store behind the counter:

- printed copy of Emergency Procedures
- Advanced First Aid kit
- Flares (for setting up STARS landing site
- Air Horn with hand pump
- Small Fire Extinguisher


During the summer months, there is a water trailer parked outside, as well as a basic First Aid Kit and an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) placed in front of the Resort Store Community Building. During the winter months this medical equipment is available through an Emergency Volunteer or by calling Curtis. Other medical equipment including EpiPens and Naloxone (opioid overdose) kits are always available through these individuals.

EpiPen & Naloxone Kits

Many people at the Resort have their own personal EpiPens & Naloxone (opioid overdose) kits on their lot, and have offered to make them available if needed. Unlike the Contact List, this information is not made available until there is a need for the item. If you would be able to provide either of these items in the event of an emergency then please contact Curtis and he will add you to this confidential list.

Directions to Fawcett Lake Resort - search Google Maps for Fawcett Lake Resort, Smith, AB

- LSD # 8, SE quarter, section 12, township 73, range 26, west of 4th Smith is straight north of Westlock and straight east of Slave Lake
- turn off of highway #2 near the north end of highway #44
- take highway #2A north straight into Smith. The Post Office is right on the highway (Canadian flag). Additional directions from Smith
- go north through Smith, cross the Athabasca river and turn right onto Fawcett Lake East Road (also known as East Fawcett Road)
- follow the signs and distance markers for 27 km turning as follows:
 - turn left after distance marker 6 km
 - turn left again at distance marker 10 km
 - turn left again just before distance marker 18 km and continue over the hill
 - take first left turn after Municipal Boat Launch towards the Fawcett Lake Resort entrance




Many various situations at the Resort can be an emergency. For a non-medical emergency see the Fawcett Lake Resort Non-Medical Emergency Procedures page (should be on the other side of this sheet).

Immediately ensure that you and everyone else are out of immediate danger and that emergency first aid is being provided as appropriate. Consider contacting an Emergency volunteer with First Aid skills as listed on the Contact List page (orange) or call Curtis for assistance (see step 3). For access to medical equipment (including an AED) see the Directions page.

- 1. Do not call 911 for an ambulance, instead for a S.T.A.R.S. helicopter call 1.888.888.4567 and at the prompt, press 1 to indicate it is an emergency. After this call is completed then call 911 if necessary.
- Tell them the emergency situation and our **registered location number of 3547** to identify who and where we are. Tell them we are at Fawcett Lake Resort, north-east of Smith, Alberta.
- -. If asked, confirm with them that our **actual location** (legal land description, or LSD) is: **Legal Sub-Division** (LSD) # 8, SE quarter, section 12, township 73, range 26, west of 4th
- A helicopter is not always available. If asked, provide the detailed directions at the bottom of page 2 of the Contact List page (orange). Then offer to send an Escort to meet them at the Smith Post Office.
- 2. Select someone with a cellular phone to be a Greeter who can greet the ambulance or helicopter at the Resort entrance or landing area. If necessary select someone else with another cellular phone to be an Escort to meet the ambulance in Smith and escort it to the Resort.
- **3**. Call Curtis at 587.877.0746 with all details of the situation and the cellular phone numbers where he can reach both the Greeter, and the Escort (if there is one). Curtis will keep each of them posted on the ambulance arrival status. If he does not answer then hang up and call the number again, leaving a message if necessary. If he does not return the call within 2 minutes, call Catherine at 403.896.1103.
- **4**. If needed, send the Escort with a cellular phone to meet the ambulance at the Smith Post Office (near the Canadian flag) and then lead them to the Resort
- consider transporting the person in need to Smith to be placed in the ambulance when it arrives there
- 5. Locate the manager of the Resort (Dale & Anita at lot 82) and tell them the emergency situation.
- 6. If the helicopter is coming, clear an area for it to land, and make it recognizable from the air
- the best area is likely the cul-de-sac in Deer Meadow (section A) at the south end of the Resort
- the landing area must be level ground about 100 feet across and away from tall trees or other barriers
- clear the landing area of loose debris that could be blown by wind from helicopter
- mark four corners of the area with flares, cones, lights, or headlights
- ensure everyone remains 100 feet from the area when the helicopter is landing or taking off
- S.T.A.R.S. personnel will exit helicopter from the upwind side (likely the side closest to lake)
- **7**. Send the Greeter with the cellular phone to wait for the ambulance at the Resort entrance or for the helicopter at the landing area to provide a situation update to them when they arrive.
- do not approach the landed helicopter. S.T.A.R.S. personnel will approach you

Immediately **ensure that you and everyone else are out of immediate danger.** Consider contacting an Emergency volunteer as listed on the Contact List page (orange) or call Curtis for assistance (see step 3)

- 1. If the police, fire department, or other emergency service is needed then **call 911** and tell them the emergency situation. Tell them we are at Fawcett Lake Resort, north-east of Smith, Alberta. If asked, provide the detailed directions at the bottom of page 2 of the Contact List page (orange). Then offer to send an Escort to meet them at the Smith Post Office.
- after the call is completed **call the Wildlife Emergency Office (780.523.6526) as well** and tell them the same information (they are often able to respond much sooner).
- If asked, tell them that our actual location (legal land description, or LSD) is:
 Legal Sub-Division (LSD) # 8, SE quarter, section 12, township 73, range 26, west of 4th
- 2. If emergency services are coming then select someone with a cellular phone to be a Greeter who can greet the emergency services at the Resort entrance. If necessary select someone else with another cellular phone to be an Escort to meet them in Smith and escort them to the Resort.
- 3. Call Curtis at 587.877.0746 with all details of the situation and the cellular phone numbers where he can reach both the Greeter, and the Escort (if there are any). Curtis will keep each of them posted on the emergency services arrival status. If he does not answer then hang up and call the number again, leaving a message if necessary. If he does not return the call within 2 minutes, call Catherine at 403.896.1103.
- **4**. If emergency services need one, send the Escort with a cellular phone to meet emergency services at the Smith Post Office (near the Canadian flag) and then lead them to the Resort
- **5**. Locate the manager of the Resort (Dale & Anita at lot 82) and tell them the emergency situation. The manager will sound the **Emergency Alarm** as appropriate. These signals should only be sounded by the manager, or under the direction of Resort Management:
 - series of 3 blasts ("S.O.S.") assistance is needed, everyone come to the source of the alarm
 - multiple repeated short blasts emergency in progress, stay indoors and shelter in place
 - random blasts emergency being addressed, stay away from the source of the alarm
 - one long blast all clear and the situation is under control
- **6**. If emergency services are coming, send the Greeter with the cellular phone to wait for emergency services at the Resort entrance to provide a situation update to them when they arrive.
